WHAT IS GEAR UP?

GEAR UP is a grant program **created and funded by Congress** and administered by the U.S. Department of Education.

GEAR UP helps students from low-income communities prepare for and succeed in **education and training beyond high school** so they can achieve their career goals.

PROUDLY SERVING KENTUCKY

GEAR UP serves over 500,000 students at almost 3,000 schools across the country. Programs start in middle school and continue through a student's first year of education beyond high school.

WHAT MAKES GEAR UP UNIQUE

Expands opportunity & increases mobility

GEAR UP opens doors to opportunity for students & their families by providing guidance on post-high school plans.

"I grew up in a very poor household, neither my mom or dad went to college. **I always thought going to college was taboo**, that I didn't need to go ... Honestly, before I went to GEAR UP, my plan was to work at McDonald's and just get by as much as I can. Builds community investment & partnerships

GEAR UP fosters collaboration between schools, state agencies, industry, and community organizations. Since 2000, GEAR UP KY has **partnered with 208 businesses, agencies and organizations** at the statewide and local levels to support students' successful transition to post-high school education and training.

There's a return on investment for taxpayers, as GEAR UP KY matches federal funds with an equal amount from non-federal sources. Since 2000, we have **matched our federal funding with \$83 million** in local dollars.

Demonstrates a proven track record & gets results

For over 25 years, GEAR UP has been a proven program, supporting millions and improving academic outcomes.

- GUK schools have met or exceeded statewide graduation rates since 2012 and state and national FAFSA completion rates since 2019.
- Since 2011, GUK graduating classes have surpassed statewide college-going rates for low-income students by at least 7 percentage points.

GUK students have higher college persistence rates and grades than their non-GUK peers.

Allows for local control & flexibility

GEAR UP empowers communities to identify and address their unique needs, offering tailored solutions rather than a one-size-fits-all federal approach.

GEAR UP Kentucky **employs 32 staff from the communities we serve** and **supports 450+ educators in our local schools**. We work with school administrators and staff to identify and meet the unique needs of their students and families.
